Wanda's Roses. Brisson, Pat. Honesdale, Pa. : Caroline House, Boyds Mills Press, c1994.

Wanda adopts a bush on some wasteground and her determination to make roses bloom on it involves the whole community.

Presents a portrait of a Santa Fe community garden, revealing how students and other citizens work together to select and grow annual plants, create compost, release butterflies, harvest edibles, and protect garden beds for the winter.

Inspired by a patchwork quilt, Toña and her grandmother use vacant patches of land in their neighborhood to grow vegetables, then form The Patchwork Garden Club to encourage other children to follow their example. Early readers.

Old Manhattan Has Some Farms : E-I-E-I-Grow! Lendroth, Susan. Watertown, Mass. : Charlesbridge, c2014. In this new take on "Old MacDonald," farmers are city dwellers and farms consist of rooftops, empty lots, patios, hydroponic labs, and other urban nooks. Early readers. (j) SB453 .L46 2014
